Summer Assignment

This summer you are asked to read *Mere Christianity*, by C.S. Lewis, a book that developed from a series of talks Lewis was asked to give on the BBC Radio during World War II. The book is broken down into four areas discussing what Christians believe, Lewis's arguments for the existence of God; his defense of Christian theology; an exploration of Christian ethics, and thoughts on the Christian conception of God.

- 1) Please carefully read *Mere Christianity* and choose two topics that interest you from each of the Four Books of Mere Christianity. (A total of eight individual topics.)
- 2) Develop a Google Slides Presentation, as if you were teaching a lesson on the book, using the following outline:
 - A) Using a minimum of one slide for each topic, define your topic and explain Lewis' position on it. You must also have a title slide, an introductory slide, and a concluding slide.
 - B) Label each slide with the Book it is from and the Topic you are addressing.
 - C) Offer an explanation of why this topic is essential to Christianity
 - D) Use proper Grammar and Mechanics
 - E) Be sure that the layout and design of your slideshow provides for an engaging and attractive presentation.

Grading:

This project is worth a total of 100 points determined by the quality of work and coverage of each topic, overall layout and design, Spelling/Grammar/Mechanics.

All work must be your own. Plagiarism is not acceptable and may result in a Zero and Academic Discipline through the Administration.
