## Meeting Minutes

Fr. Brian called the meeting to order at 6:02pm with a prayer led by Fr. Joy.

### **DISCUSSION**

Father Brian invited Michael A. to facilitate the meeting, expressing his desire to deepen his connection with the parishioners and "know his sheep" more intimately. He posed a key question to the Pastoral Council: *How can we assist Father Brian in getting to know his parishioners better and help them know him*, particularly those on the margins who may be less engaged or reluctant to share their voices?

Michael A. led a productive brainstorming session, following a prayer by Marcel L. asking for the Holy Spirit to guide our discernment. The council identified seven key ideas and suggestions for Father Brian to focus on:

- **Create Focus Groups**—Engage specific groups (e.g., students, seniors) to better understand their faith needs and perspectives.
- **Post Formation Questions/Questionnaire** – Regularly ask questions such as, *“Did you grow in faith from this recent activity or event? How is your prayer life? What kind of prayer practices do you find most meaningful in your life?”* to encourage reflection and dialogue.
- **Discipleship Pathway Brochure** – Develop a brochure to help parishioners discern where they are in their faith journey along the discipleship diamond.
- **Homily Question of the Week** – Introduce a weekly thought-provoking question to challenge parishioners in their faith journey.

- **Pastoral Council Listening Sessions** – Allow parishioners to share their thoughts and add council members' personal emails and phone numbers to the parish website for easy access.

These initiatives aim to strengthen relationships within the parish, promote engagement, and provide Father Brian with meaningful ways to connect with the community.

Father Brian expressed that the Discipleship Pathway is now well-developed, with programs available at each stage. The focus moving forward will be on encouraging parishioners to engage and progress along the pathway actively.

Donna H. highlighted the importance of clear communication from the pulpit, stressing the need to reassure the parish that *“we are listening.”* She suggested adding a call to action, such as: *“If you want to be heard, the next step is…”* to encourage participation and provide a clear direction for involvement.
