Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ezekiel 33:7-9; Romans 13:8-10; Matthew 18:15-20

We don't have much trouble understanding the notion that youngsters need to be corrected, at times. Call it discipline, upbringing, or whatever, we accept that children are going to need this. We don't have much trouble understanding the notion that adults who get way out of line, and break the law as well, need to be disciplined and even put into a "correctional institution" at times.

But what about lesser wrongs done to one another? There is a tugging between two separate responses to this: forgiveness and correction, that is, taking the person to task. And the gospels speak to both responses. Today's gospel reading reinforced by the Ezekiel reading from the old testament tells the disciples that if one is wronged by another, "go and point out his fault." Hopefully the other will be won over, but if not, further steps can be taken—each one harsher. Jesus does not specify the "wrong" in this instance, nor does He specify the wrong when he speaks of forgiving the wrong doer.

It seems that behind the whole process of correction or forgiveness stands the virtues of prudence and charity. It is up to the individual person in an individual instance to decide whether brotherly/sisterly correction or outright forgiveness is in order.

The August 27, 2020 meeting of the Notre Dame Pastoral Council was called to order by Frank Ryant. The group joined in reciting the Prayer and Parish Mission Statement. Present were: Fr. Jacob Rouse, Frank Ryant, Jim Truka, Brian McConnell, Mike Drees, Tom Kleve, Patti Guyer, Keith Wherry, MaryIn Shores and Joye Meyer. Absent: Duane Heit

The minutes of the May 21, 2020 meeting were reviewed. Patti Guyer made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes and approve as presented, seconded by Brian McConnell. Motion approved by consensus. The agenda was reviewed. Jim Truka made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, seconded by Mike Drees. Motion approved by consensus.

Liturgy Committee – Brian McConnell reported on the Aug. 12 Liturgy Committee meeting. Good comments have been received regarding Exposition of Blessed Sacrament prior to masses. It was reported that First Communion was held on July 12 and Confirmation was held on July 19. A new Religious Education program entitled “Cornerstone” will begin in October. Music liturgy was discussed. The pianos in church will be tuned.

Social Justice Committee – next meeting will be Oct. 6.

Community Life Committee – Joye Meyer reported on the Aug. 17 Circles of Faith meeting. Discussion was held concerning how to do the October and November dinners. The chairpeople will be contacted to get feedback from them. Funeral dinners will continue to be on hold until further notice. Fair Day will not sponsor a meal. A dunk tank for the school students will be held as well as a Raffle.

The May 28 Faith Formation Commission Meeting minutes were reviewed. Due to Covid, school and Rel. Ed. went virtual in March. The 6th grade graduation mass was re-scheduled in August. Catholic Heart Work Camp was also cancelled. Rel. Ed. fundraisers were cancelled. Book Club will resume in the fall. Faith Formation Commission terms were extended for another year. Lynette Andera will fill a vacant position. Reports were given on Moving with Mission, Impact, RCIA and the Howard County Bible Reading Marathon.

Mike Drees reported on the Catholic School Board Minutes from the June 10 and Aug. 5 meetings. Election of officers was held. Reports were given on the Buildings and Grounds stating the door strikes have been installed; parking lot games were repainted and mulch placed under playground equipment. Fair Day plans include a dunk tank and raffle. Tee Time for Technology was held with profit of \$7,150. Scrip will not be sold in church yet in September. Sales continue to be good through the parish office. BLT (Building Leadership Team) reported on Return to Learn plans. Playgroup will not be offered this year. A report was given on Kids Club and STO.

Stewardship Committee-next meeting will be Sept. 21.

MaryIn Shores reported on July 14 and Aug. 11 Finance Council meetings. A report was given on the Return to Learn plan for the school. Fundraisers were discussed. Football Mania will be held. End of the fiscal year showed the income at 95.5% with budget envelopes at 98.5% of the budgeted amount and expenses at 96.6% of the budgeted amount. Fr. Jacob reported new ministries continue to be added at weekend masses.

Buildings and Grounds: Summer projects have been completed. An air conditioner for the church needed to be replaced. A system will be put in the rectory to eliminate future problems with water in the basement. New steps have been installed going into the church sacristy door. Estimates will be checked into to re-shingle the parish office roof.

Emergency Management Committee (EMC) – No report.

Fr. Jacob reported he continues to focus on the sacraments and continues to add ministries as he feels is safe. He has had quite a few Baptisms and Weddings. He is now doing wedding preparation. He reported on the school’s Building Leadership Team and the Return to Learn plan and Kids Club. He explained the decision to only allow school students and personnel at the Thursday morning School Mass. Everyone else is invited to watch the livestream for the present time. He gave a brief review of the new Rel. Ed. program “Cornerstone” developed by Melanie Vobr which focuses on discipleship.

Pastoral Council members signed “Conflict of Interest Policy” Forms.

The next Pastoral Council meeting is scheduled September 24, 2020. Mike Drees made a motion to adjourn, seconded by MaryIn Shores. Motion approved by consensus.
