Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46; 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1; Mark 1:40-45

Just before we go into the Lenten season we are given another look at Jesus' healing ministry. Today's episode involves the healing of a leper.

The New Testament uses the word "leper" to describe a number of skin diseases, all of which render the sufferer "unclean": that is, unfit to engage in the ordinary day-to-day association with the rest of the community. The lepers suffered an additional burden, namely, the community saw them as sinful—the disease was an indication of some sort of moral depravity on the part of the leper.

When a leper came to Jesus, as we hear today, he was taking great risk. But he also had great faith, and because of that faith Jesus made him whole. Jesus broke through the negative power that was so visibly present by His touch and His word. Jesus took on the forces of darkness, sin, rejection, exclusion from community and turned them around at once.

There was a power emanating from the Lord that drew people to Him: it was a power of compassion, light, healing of body and spirit.

The Lenten Sundays will bring all this to light in a more explicit manner.

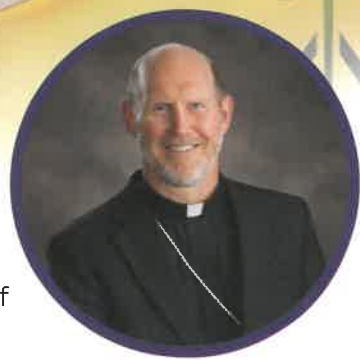
