En consonancia con el Domingo anterior y con toda la predicación de Jesús de Nazaret, el texto del evangelio de hoy continúa con la misma temática: a los discípulos, a los pequeños, a los mansos, a los humildes “se os ha dado el conocer los misterios del Reino de los Cielos...” Por eso les habla **en parábolas**: el recurso oral y pedagógico preferido por Jesús. Un lenguaje comparativo y sencillo, coloquial, fácil de ser entendido por la gente sencilla, con imágenes del entorno cotidiano para involucrar e interpelar al auditorio.

Entonces el mejor terreno, la tierra buena, fértil, feraz, para la semilla sembrada por Dios-Padre (semilla que es su Palabra, Palabra de Dios que es Jesús mismo, Verbo del Padre) es el de la humildad como condición “sine qua non” para vivir **la** fe o, mejor, para vivir **en** fe, en alegre esperanza, obediente confianza y total dependencia – como hijos – del Padre bueno del cielo.

Dichosos nosotros hoy si – humildes – vemos lo que vemos y oímos lo que oímos: el poder y la misericordia de Dios manifestados en la persona, en los hechos y palabras de Jesús de Nazaret. Más dichosos si viviendo en la vida y en el amor de Dios, cumpliendo su voluntad, damos fruto, es decir: somos capaces de dar de ese mismo amor, con obras, a nuestros hermanos y hermanas, especialmente a los más necesitados.

#### **Happy Anniversary, Father Campbell!!**

Father Colm Campbell will celebrate his Golden Jubilee at today’s 12:30 Mass. A reception in the Murphy Center will follow. All are welcome.

Fr. Campbell was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland. He was ordained in Maynooth Seminary and served as a priest of the Diocese of Down-Connor. Fr. Campbell came to Brooklyn in 1992 to direct the Irish Apostolate there and eventually became the National Director. He spent two years at Holy Trinity in that position, before moving on to Washington and Philadelphia for several years, until his health required a change. He is also the “Founding Father” of the Irish Center in Queens; many of those attending today’s Mass are Fr. Campbell’s flock from the Irish Center.

As some of you know, even after leaving, Fr. Campbell frequently came back into Manhattan for the Saturday 5:30 Vigil Mass at Holy Trinity. He finally returned to us for good last November. We are happy he is here – and look forward to celebrating his next fifty years!
