Every year we celebrate the great **Solemnity of Pentecost** as the day when the frightened Apostles of Jesus, who knew about the Resurrection and knew about the fulfillment of the Old Testament Messiah Scriptures, and who personally saw the resurrected Savior, remained "closed up," in the Upper Room. More significantly, they remained "closed minded." They knew the "what" and "why" and "how" of the Faith but lacked the fearless courage to act on it. This is why Pentecost is so important; without it there would be no Church! The Holy Spirit "got them up and going" to "shout from the housetops" what they believed: **Christ has risen from the dead ... and we will live forever!** Be more open to reviving that Spirit in yourself. People will notice, follow and find their Hope for living in Christ, our Savior.

Pope Francis has recently established a new feast for the Universal Church honoring Mary as the "**Mother of the Church**," to be celebrated annually on Pentecost Monday. Veneration of Mary as Mother of the Church has ancient roots in Catholic tradition and Scripture. In 1964, at the Second Vatican Council, 1962-65, Blessed Pope Paul VI formally declared Mary as the Mother of the Church, and invited Catholics to ask for her supportive prayers. During the 1975 Jubilee Year, the Church established a special Mass for Mary under the title of Mary, Mother of the Church.

This third Person is called, in technical language, the Holy Ghost or the 'spirit' of God. Do not be worried or surprised if you find it (or Him) rather vaguer or more shadowy in your mind than the other two. I think there is a reason why that must be so. In the Christian life you are not usually looking at Him: He is always acting through you. If you think of the Father as something 'out there', in front of you, and of the Son as something standing at your side, helping you to pray, trying to turn you into another son, then you have to think of the third Person as something inside you, or behind you. Perhaps some people might find it easier to begin with the third Person and work backwards. God is love, and that love works through men – especially through the whole community of Christians. But this spirit of love is, from all eternity, a love going on between the Father and Son.

And now, what does it all matter? It matters more than anything else in the world. The whole dance, or drama, or pattern of this three-Personal life is to be played out in each one of us: or (putting it the other way round) each one of us has got to enter that pattern, take his place in that dance. There is no other way to the happiness for which we were made. Good things as well as bad, you know, are caught by a kind of infection. If you want to get warm you must stand near the fire: if you want to be wet you must get into the water. If you want joy, power, peace, eternal life, you must get close to, or even into, the thing that has them ... They are a great fountain of energy and beauty spurting up at the very centre of reality. If you are close to it, the spray will wet you: if you are not, you will remain dry. Once a man is united to God, how could he not live forever? Once a man is separated from God, what can he do but wither and die?
