



In your searches, notice if the author(s) employs one-sided positions, exaggerations, misleading half-truths, absolute judgments, inflammatory and outlandish claims, mean-spiritedness, unfair attacks, self-righteousness or defensiveness.

**In other words, do they highlight the worst in the human condition?**


Prudent Christians have always sought to nurture and practice a balanced picture of redeemed human beings. Common sense, fairmindedness and genuine joy have always been golden.

**So, check out the author(s), and the milieu in which information is presented. Be wary!**

You would also be wise to consult the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* [just GOOGLE CCC and the topic] and discuss these things, intelligently, with a **person who knows theology** and is committed to enlightening inquiring minds and hearts and thus edifying the Church.

### + A Reflection +

#### "WHEN THEY HAD THEIR FILL ..."

"Today's Gospel reading narrates Jesus' feeding of the five thousand. Facing a hungry crowd of thousands on the mountainside, Jesus feeds them from five barley loaves and two fish. In describing Jesus' actions, John employs the Eucharistic imagery and actions present in the Synoptic Gospels: Jesus 'took the loaves,' 'gave thanks,' and 'distributed them.' The five thousand ate the fish and loaves until 'they had had their fill.' Many of those who witnessed this event concluded, 'This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world.'

In the First Reading, we hear about another miraculous feeding. Elisha is able to feed a hundred people with just twenty barley loaves and some corn. It is very likely that many in Jesus' crowd of five thousand recognized the resemblance and connection to the prophetic tradition."
