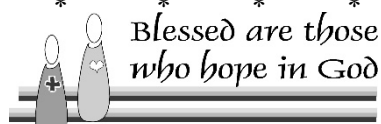

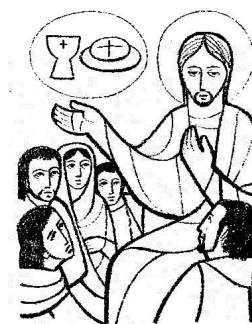

## Verdadera comida y verdadera bebida

### ✠ THE MASS OF ALL AGES ✠

"As early as the second century we have the witness of St. Justin Martyr for the basic lines of the order of the Eucharistic celebration. They have stayed the same until our own day for all the great liturgical families. St. Justin wrote to the pagan emperor Antonius Pius (138-161) around the year 155, explaining what Christians did:

On the day we call the day of the sun, all who dwell in the city or country gather in the same place.

The memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read, as much as time permits.

When the reader has finished, he who presides over those gathered admonishes and challenges them to imitate these beautiful things.

Then we all rise together and offer prayers for ourselves ... and for all others, wherever they may be, so that we may be found righteous by our life and actions, and faithful to the commandments, so as to obtain eternal salvation.

When the prayers are concluded we exchange the kiss.

Then someone brings bread and a cup of water and wine mixed together to him who presides over the brethren.

He takes them and offers a praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and the Holy Spirit and for a considerable time he gives thanks (in Greek: *eucharistian*) that we have been judged worthy of these gifts.

When he has concluded the prayers and thanksgivings, all present give voice to an acclamation by saying: 'Amen.'

When he who presides has given thanks and the people have responded, those whom we call deacons give to those present the 'eucharisted' bread, wine and water and take them to those who are absent."

- "El cáliz de nuestra acción de gracias, ¿no nos une a todos en la sangre de Cristo? Y el pan que partimos, ¿no nos une a todos en el cuerpo de Cristo?"
- El pan que compartimos en la mesa del Señor nos une a todos los cristianos en el cuerpo de Cristo. El pan es uno; así nosotros, aunque somos muchos, formamos un solo cuerpo.
- Por tanto, el cuerpo eucarístico de Cristo está en relación directa con la asamblea eclesial, que es el cuerpo místico de Cristo. Por eso la eucaristía nos exige la unión y amor fraterno del grupo que celebra con fe la cena del Señor. No tiene sentido celebrar con devoción la eucaristía si no existe una comunidad de amor.
- Tenemos que reconocer que existe una diferencia profunda entre las primeras comunidades de la Iglesia apostólica, que eran pequeñas y donde todos se conocían, y nuestras asambleas dominicales, formadas por cientos de personas que viven dispersas en la gran ciudad.
- Tenemos que ser realistas. No podemos pretender que las personas que se reúnen en esta iglesia para participar en la misa dominical se conozcan y establezcan lazos de amistad. Pero sí es posible tejer una comunidad afectiva, en la que compartamos unos valores comunes: la fe en Cristo, el amor a la Iglesia, la solidaridad con los pobres, el compromiso con la construcción de una convivencia basada en el respeto, la tolerancia y la equidad.
- Aunque no nos conozcamos, es posible compartir unos valores y converger en un proyecto de Iglesia y de sociedad.
