### Why Not EASTER Year-Round?

This is an excerpt from the words of St. John Paul II, at Adelaide, Australia on Nov. 30, 1988

“We do not pretend that life is all beauty. We are aware of darkness and sin, of poverty and pain. But we know Jesus has conquered sin and passed through his own pain to the glory of the Resurrection. And we live in the light of his Paschal Mystery – the mystery of His Death and Resurrection. **“We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song!”** We are not looking for a shallow joy but rather a joy that comes from faith, that grows through unselfish love, that respects the “fundamental duty of love of neighbor, without which it would be unbecoming to speak of Joy.” We realize that joy is demanding; it demands unselfishness; and a readiness to say with Mary: “Be it done unto me according to Your word.”

## Domingo de la Misericordia Divina



Con las apariciones del resucitado da comienzo nuestra fe. Creemos porque el Señor resucitó. Para que aparezca la vida tiene que ser removida la muerte. No hay prueba más grande que el superar el vacío de la muerte, de ahí que algo tan grandioso sea difícil de captar y de aceptar sin fe. Cuando dudamos de la fe es que no hemos pasado por la experiencia de la resurrección. Pedimos “ver” para creer cuando lo que necesitamos es experimentar para ver. El poder ver al resucitado es un don de Dios, que Él concede al que quiere.

La confesión de fe de Tomás es la auténtica confesión de fe del creyente. Nosotros no hemos visto y creemos, por eso Jesús nos llama bienaventurados. La bienaventuranza de los que no hemos visto se basa en la confianza en la Palabra antes que en las pruebas. La Palabra no se ve y en cambio tiene el poder de transformarnos para experimentar la conversión y la resurrección. Ser cristiano es acoger la Palabra con plena confianza.

Las apariciones no eran subjetivas, imaginativas, sino reales. No es una creación de la fantasía humana, sino el cuerpo real del Señor. Cuando la gente alejada pregunta dónde está Dios bien le podemos decir que dejándose ver por todas las partes de la vida. Para verlo hacen falta los ojos de la fe y la confianza en el amor.

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### + An Easter Reflection +

**“BLESSES ARE THOSE WHO HAVE NOT SEEN ...”**

“Last Sunday, the Church began to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord with a call to bear witness to what God has done in Christ. Today’s readings also explore what it means to be a witness. The New Testament Greek word for ‘witness’ is martyr. As early Christians encountered resistance and even persecution, the word took on new meaning: witness to Christ could cost imprisonment or even life itself.

In the Gospel, John explains how the risen Christ appears to his disciples, who are taking refuge behind locked doors. He sends them for to proclaim the Good News despite their fear: they will be supported in their witness.”
