Simple LENTEN Norms

Lenten Fasting & Abstinence from Meat

FASTING means eating 1 full meal a day, and 2 smaller meals that do not add up to a full meal.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT means eating no meat IF you are over the age of <u>14</u>.

- **1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are obligatory days of fasting <u>and</u> abstinence.
- 2. Obligatory Fasting applies from age 18-59.
- **3. All Lenten Fridays** are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.



→ NORMAS PARA LA CUARESMA

En la constitución de la Sagrada Liturgia se declara: "los tidos elementos que son especialmente característicos de la repascuas – el recuerdo del bautismo o la preparación para el mismo y la penitencia – deben recibir el mayor énfasis en la liturgia. Es por medio de ellos que la Iglesia prepara a los fideleles para la celebración, el ayuno y la limosna en su empeño de llevar a cabo las obras de misericordia. En realidad, ellos son una preparación por la muerte. El ayuno es obligatorio, desda los 18 hasta los 59 años de edad. La abstinencia prohibe comore carne, y oblige desde los 14 años en adelante. El Viernes Santo este dia de a uno y abstinencia. Todos los viernes de la Curesma son dias de abstenencia.

El ayuno pide que solamente se tenga una comida completa durante el dia. Se podrán tener dos comidas ligeres, pero ellos no deberán igualar a otra comida completa. Vamos a reconocer estas practices como oportunidades de jubilo en nuestra preparación para la Pascua.

★ ASH WEDNESDAY & LENTEN REGULATIONS **★**

As we do every year at this time, we offer a few remarks and clarifications that may be helpful regarding Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season:

In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, we are informed that: "the two elements which are especially characteristic of Lent – *recalling of baptism* (or the preparation for it) and *penance* – should be given greater emphasis ... It is by means of them that the Church prepares the faithful for the celebration of Easter, while they hear God's word more frequently and devote more time to prayer."

The traditional practices include <u>prayer</u>, <u>fasting and almsgiving</u> as means of developing a more direct sense of the preparation for death. Many choose to make daily Mass a part of their Lenten routine.

The Church obliges to <u>fast</u> all those between the ages of 18 and 59 years, and to <u>abstinence</u> all those over 14 years old. *Fasting* prescribes that only one full meal a day be taken; the other two meals should be smaller and not equal the main meal. *Abstinence* forbids the eating of meat. Note especially:

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.
- All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

Please bear in mind that these restrictions are not to be seen negatively, but as *a uniquely positive way* to prepare for the joy of the coming Easter.

Note, too, the importance of receiving ashes in conjuncttion with the reading of Scripture. The ashes themselves have little meaning – they can even be empty superstition or a morbid reminder of death. But received in the light of God's revealing Word reminds us that it is not the death of the body, but of the soul that is to be feared. As we are called to return to God with our whole heart, the reception of ashes becomes for us the symbol of hearts thus desiring to turn to a "gracious and merciful" God.

Who receives ashes? Baptized individuals who have reached the age of reason and Catechumens may receive ashes; babies and young children who have not yet received the Sacrament of penance should not be presented to receive ashes – ashes are intended for those capable of personal sin.

On **Ash Wednesday**, Masses will be offered at:

- 9:00 AM
- 12:15 PM
- 5:30 PM
- 7:00 PM (in Spanish)

Please note: Ashes will be distributed <u>during</u> each Mass.

- Ash Wednesday is February 22nd
- Easter is April 9th.

Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox.
