

Welcome back returning UWSP students! And welcome to all new UWSP students! Hope you are well rested from your summer break and come ready for a full year of exercising body, mind... and soul!! Holy Spirit Parish is home-away-from-home for lots of students and we'd love to be yours as well. Please check out the page in this bulletin listing some of the opportunities to meet good people and grow in your faith that await you in the coming weeks. Begin with today's Gospel... If you are feeling small and a bit out of place this is really good news. You are just the kind of person other normal, healthy people are looking to meet. Or, as Jesus said, those who humble themselves will be exalted.

One of the great things about being a part of Holy Spirit parish is meeting other worldly-humble, spiritually-great people. We were leaving the SpiritFEST wrap up meeting last Monday when one of the team members said: “that Brant Bergeron is such a humble guy.” We were all feeling tremendous gratitude and admiration for Brant after getting the final results of the second SpiritFEST he chaired.

In numbers, profit from SpiritFEST 2019 increased by 54% over SpiritFEST - 2018 from \$9,829 to \$15,140. The main raffle was up almost \$2,000 over last year. The outdoor food stand with the smoked meat sandwiches was up almost \$1,000. All of the other events were up as well except for Bingo. Kostka Hall was packed from start to finish, but we could only run it for two hours because it was in the same hall as the dinner.

Thank you to all who volunteered to work at the picnic and thank you to all who donated raffle baskets, cakewalk cakes, bought raffle tickets or came to be a part of the day itself. Even more than the financial profit, our parish family was knit more closely together and the spirit of Christ set loose more fully.

You would think it would be hard to find someone to replace such a humble and effective person like Brant. And you would be right. We couldn't find a person to take his place. But we have found four people who are ready to pick up where Brant leaves off and continue to grow this celebration. Tom & Laurie Weinfurter and Mike & Judy Splinter have agreed to co-chair SpiritFEST 2020! And, they have already begun making the reservations for next year's picnic. Please thank them when you see them. Better yet, ask them how you can help!

September will be an exciting month in many ways, including our building project. Please come next Sunday for the Topping Off ceremony after the 10 a.m. Mass. The final beam we are signing will be placed atop the new carport entrance. Then we will see the full contours of our new ministry center.

The following week, beginning Monday Sept. 16th, the plan is to start tearing up the parking lot! Removing the present blacktop and the base below it, the foundation of the old school!, then filling in the hole, laying a new base and re-blacktopping is expected to take three weeks. We have approached the university for use of their parking lots nearby. But even with their use, this will be a major disruption of life! In particular, there will be no handicapped access except for weekend Masses and Spirit Nights during this time. Morning weekday Masses and Adoration will be held at the Newman Center Chapel.

Stay tuned! Though there are uncertainties, I am sure of one thing. These inconveniences, these frustrations, these humblings... If embraced... will only deepen and strengthen our Spirit and future joy. I stand on Christ's words: the one who humbles himself shall be exalted.

Soon it will be time to hoist the last steel I-Beam into place, but only after all interested parishioners and guests were given an opportunity to sign the mammoth piece of steel. So did you sign your name on the 35 foot heavy beam?



People have asked exactly where is the beam going to be located? On the West side of our Ministry Center we are going to have a roof extending out from the rear wall of the Ministry Center about 37 feet to the West and the roof will be about 28 feet in length in a North to South direction. The signed I-Beam will support the North side of the Car Port drive-through roof.



September 16th is also the date scheduled for the West Parking lot work to begin: old blacktop removed, new sub-base materials installed and a new blacktop surface to be laid. One added bonus is lot lighting to be added. The new parking lot surface will be great!


