“Who among you would not leave the ninety nine and go in search of the lost one?”  
(Luke 15:4)

Steve Angrisano says this about his first Spirit Night presentation to us a week from Monday:

*“Within each of us there is a deep desire to encounter God. We are “hardwired” to desire Him! Many people are waiting for some otherworldly experience in a mountaintop chapel while, as Mother Theresa always reminded us, the face of Jesus is much closer... and we often walk right by. In many ways, to encounter Jesus is simply to open our eyes and see Him in our everyday.”*

To meet Steve or see him in action is to meet one whose heart is filled with the joy of having found Jesus in many lost sheep. Through song and story he opens eyes to the presence of Christ in others and in ourselves

Please plan on coming Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings of next week to have your eyes and heart opened. We begin at 6:30 p.m. in Church. Saturday morning, Sept. 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:30 a.m., Steve will lead a workshop for musicians and singers. He will speak at all the Masses Saturday and Sunday. Saturday night he'll join in the fun of Bingo & Pizza after the 5 p.m. Mass. Monday morning he is speaking to the Pacelli High School student body. Tuesday morning he is leading a retreat for Holy Spirit and St. Bron's parish staffs. Tuesday afternoon he will lead a student body assembly at Pacelli Middle School. And, at 5 p.m. Wednesday he will join the Student Supper at the Newman Center. He is willing to go anywhere in search of lost sheep ... those who do not know Christ is in them.

Keep an eye open as well for your copy of the Parish Annual Report. It will include financial reports on our parish operating expenses, endowments, Diocesan Annual Appeal and Building Fund. But it will also include summaries of what has happened in each area of ministry in our parish and the projects they want to tackle in the coming year. We are hoping you hear in this report the Good Shepherd calling you!! We hope there will be some ministry described in the report that calls you to get involved more deeply.

Then the following weekend, Sept. 28 & 29, we'll have a Ministry Fair after all Masses. We will have a packet for everyone in the parish to pick up. It will list all of the volunteer opportunities in the parish now. (The list has tripled!) Also, there will be a census form to update all of your membership information. Finally, there will be an invitation to update your financial support of the parish as well. Please reflect on these invitations and give a heart-felt response.


These will be days of transformation inwardly and outwardly. As has been the case all year, even as an outer building is rising up out of the ground, the temple made of living stones has been rising up as well. On weekends and for Spirit Nights, the parking between the rectory and the church will be set aside for Handicapped parking. From there you will be able to enter any church door including the temporary one by the elevator. For these events please park in the Hospital Lot, or one of the University Lots. They are free after business hours and on weekends.

Weekday Masses will be at the Newman Center Chapel. The University has agreed to allow us to park in Lot T (behind the Newman Center) from 8:00 and 9:15 a.m. while the parking lot is being replaced. The parking lot work is expected to take between three and four weeks, depending on what we find beneath the present blacktop.

As you come and go, please keep an eye out for lost sheep!

## Construction Zone Weekly

Last Sunday the final steel beam was hoisted into position setting the stage for the pre-engineered, cold rolled metal roof trusses to be set in place for our carport roof on the West side of the new Ministry Center. A 1 1/2" metal deck will be fastened to the roof trusses with plywood sheathing, 15# felt roofing paper and shingles will complete the carport roof.



Ellis workers continue to install steel studs that form the interior walls of our new offices and other rooms inside the building. The interior rooms are beginning to show their dimensional sizes.

Large PVC roof drain pipes, which will carry rain water from our new semi-flat roof to the ground surface, have been installed.



Masons are still quite busy with the brick on the exterior of the building. They are also laying a horizontal stone accent band on the brick veneered

exterior. This will add a beautiful feature to the new brick wall mirroring a similar feature band of our church building.

Fun Fact: The final steel beam that friends and parishioners signed was blessed last Sunday. It is about 37 feet long and weighs in at over 2,300 pounds!


