## Construction Zone Weekly

Workmen have been busy hanging sheetrock in the new Ministry Center. The gypsum sheetrock is cut to size and screwed to the steel wall studs, throughout the building. Fiberglass mesh tape is applied to sheetrock joints



and all joints and screws are topped with drywall compound. They are then sanded smooth. After that, they are treated with a sprayed texture finish, a coat of primer paint and a final coat of finish paint.




The East wall of the Ministry Center has a bumped out area, with openings for three large radius top windows that have cast stone decorative surrounds. This area also has brick quoin (coin) corners in addition to decorative dentil brickwork veneer at the top of the parapet wall. All of these features are also included in the brickwork and windows of the church. These details help the new addition exterior to flow easily into the exterior of the church. Be sure to give the brickwork on the addition and church a closer look when you come to Mass.




And...in big news... concrete work in the parking lot is mostly complete. Blacktop will follow soon.


