Let's Get Back to What We Love . . . Mass!

At this stage in the pandemic, all of us long to reconnect with our family members, friends and communities and get back to what we love, including Mass. Here, at Holy Spirit, we are disciples "Called to Worship, Sent to Serve." We, *the staff of Holy Spirit parish, stand united in believing one way we are sent to serve today is by getting vaccinated against the coronavirus. We have all been vaccinated and urge you to be as well, unless you have special medical conditions that prevent this.* We long to gather as a full community again and that will only be possible when the vast majority of people have been vaccinated. That is why we are encouraging you to reflect on the following information from Health Action Alliance as you consider whether it's time to get vaccinated.



How do COVID-19 vaccines work?

Vaccines save lives. These vaccines teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19 without having to get sick or put ourselves and others at risk of severe illness and death.

Getting vaccinated is a much safer way to build protection than getting the disease. COVID-19 can have serious, long-term or life-threatening complications, and there is no way to know how COVID-19 will affect you.

The vaccines will not give you COVID-19. When researching information and confirming facts on vaccines, pay attention to medical experts and primary sources like CDC and FDA.

The vaccines are free and administered by trained health professionals. All of them are safe and effective. *The Vatican notes that "from the ethical point of view, the morality of vaccination depends not only on the duty to protect one's own health, but also on the duty to pursue the common good." They, along with the USCCB, state further that, "if one can choose among equally safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines, the vaccine with the least connection to abortion-derived cell lines should be chosen. Pfizer and Moderna did use an abortion-derived cell line for testing, they did not use the problematic cell line in their vaccine development and production." The USCCB discourages Catholics from getting the Johnson and Johnson vaccine if given a choice because an abortion derived cell line is used in the production of this vaccine, "raising additional moral concerns."*

As with any medical decision, if you have particular questions or concerns related to your overall health and well-being you should speak with your doctor or healthcare provider about whether COVID-19 vaccines are right for you. Together, we can get back to what we love, including Mass, small faith-sharing groups and parish-family gatherings that help to deepen our relationship with Jesus and with one another. Together, we can move, once again, toward our mission as disciples "Called to Worship, Sent to Serve."

Haiti Well Project Update

We've received the draft "Request for Proposal" from Northwater Consulting. This document outlines the scope of the project for the well drilling contractors to provide us with the information needed to evaluate their proposal and choose a well drilling company.

We will review the document and work with Northwater on finalizing it within the coming weeks. Then we will send it to the well drilling companies. Our next window of opportunity to drill the well is in the dry season - June through August.

I will continue to keep you updated on our progress. We will persevere in our goal of bringing clean drinking water to the school and rectory in Lomas Haiti. Thank you for your continued support and prayers. God Bless!

Holy Spirit Finances

As expected April’s Expenses were significantly higher than Revenue. The good news is that Monthly Revenue was over \$12,000 better than the \$75,000 we need to average each month. And while Expenses for the month were greater than Budget, the YTD Actual expenses of \$849,550 are about \$36,000 under budget. I remain optimistic that we can have revenue to match expenses by 6-30-21.

Phase II of Building Project is Complete!

With the completion of the painting of the interior of the Church, Phase II of our Building on a Firm Foundation building program is complete! Congratulations Holy Spirit Parish and thank you to all who have sacrificed to make this possible, especially those who have been so amazingly faithful to your financial pledges.


On March 8th of 2020 we dedicated the new Ministry Center. One of many Covid-19 blessings immediately appeared. Contractors were eager for work and so renovations of the church began almost immediately and progressed months ahead of the anticipated schedule.

A new baptismal font accommodating both adult and infant baptisms was custom built to match the woodwork of the altar and ambo. A new handicapped accessible ramp into the sanctuary frames the new baptistery.

A new energy efficient heating system, separate from the old school boiler, was installed. A new air exchange system that is constantly bringing fresh outside air into our worship space is visible from outside in the large ducts ascending the church roof on the south side. A new air conditioning system was also installed.

The lighting system was upgraded to energy efficient LED including a new control panel, new and relocated spot-

lights. The two stained glass windows adjacent to the new Ministry Center were backlit. The sound system was upgraded with new speakers and microphones. Not part of the original plan, a new video system was installed to allow us to do professional recording and live streaming of our services. The ceiling fans were replaced.



Beams, bolts, striker and framing were replaced in the bell tower. And tuck pointing prepared the exterior for the next 100 years of life.

We still have many improvements on our to do list. New sanctuary carpet will be installed. Eagle Scout Luke Carpenter, family and friends have begun re-upholstering the padded chairs in the Church and Ministry Center. Our Nesting Committee is working on permanent furnishings for the Ministry Center, information kiosks, interior signage, memorials to past pastors and to the School

Sisters of St. Joseph, and renovation of Kostka Hall.

The future of the rectory is still being discerned. As possibilities become clear they will be brought forward to our Councils and parish family. If everyone is able to fulfill their pledges, the entire cost of this construction, including the loan from the diocese, will be paid at the end of the pledge program in 2023. But we must stop and celebrate that Phase I and Phase II construction are complete. Holy Spirit Parish, you have laid a firm foundation for the next one hundred years of living and loving and serving our Lord. Well done!

Campus Ministry Wrap-Up



Care for Our Earth: Four Perspectives Suggestions from our Earth Week Event

At our Earth Week panel on April 21, four parish presenters offered the following suggestions, based on their training and work experience, on how we can help care for our earth.

Trevor Frank (Soils)

Trevor works in research at Illinois Foundation Seeds in Plover. His talk focused on cover crops used in conjunction with other agricultural crops, primarily corn. The use of cover crops minimizes the impact of tilling and use of pesticides on the soils.

Ideas to support soil conservation:

- volunteer to work with the USDA or DNR to find ways to lessen nitrates in our area.
- read literature encouraging friendly practices and visit with farmers.
- become acquainted and work with the UW-Extension Offices in our area.

Ryan Negro (Solar Energy)

Ryan works as a solar site assessor at PV Systems in Amherst. He focused on the financial as well as the environmental benefits of solar installations.

Considerations to be more energy efficient:

- be cognizant that neither coal nor natural gas are native products of WI.
- be conscious of energy usage regularly, not just when the power is out
- update old appliances for energy efficient ones, change lightbulbs to LED bulbs
- practice going energy free when possible (e.g., hang laundry out side, hand wash dishes).
- open window dressings in winter to bring in sun, reducing furnace usage; in the summer, close window dressings to keep heat outside.
- get an energy audit to ascertain areas of energy leakage.
- when and if possible, trade your auto for a hybrid or an electric.

Eric Olson (Water)

Eric is Director of UW Extension Lakes which works with over 800 local lake associations and the Wisconsin DNR to educate and collaborate on projects benefitting the future of our lakes.

Several ways to maintain clean, abundant water:

- avoid the use of pesticides and herbicides as much as possible.
- plant native plants, trees, and shrubs especially along waterways.
- embrace a slightly "messy" yard. Native plants protect both soils and water.
- recycle as much as possible.
- replace lead pipes.
- use a rain barrel to collect water from eaves.
- support organic farmers by buying their products.
- support "No Mow May" to give pollinators food from plants growing on lawns in early spring when no other food is available. This allows grasses to develop deeper root systems.

Mike Stautenmeyer (Air/Wind)

Mike is a professional meteorologist for 28 years and works for the NOAA office in Utah. He made a point that there is a difference between weather and climate change; however, because both are affected by each other, they are intertwined.

Ways to mitigate the extreme weather events now occurring frequently, in and out of season, and in unusual ways:

- use energy very, very wisely. When at all possible, use wind and solar.
- check the insulation in all buildings in which one lives and works.
- Urge State and National government leaders to take appropriate steps to reduce fossil fuel reliance. We need to reduce our usage by 7-10% each year for the next 10 years!
- recognize and accept that change is tough! Accepting the status quo will not "fix" our situation.
- start a conversation with another person about the climate, how it is changing, and what we can do to mitigate these changes.
