Parish Endowments: And The Two Shall BecomeA New Two!

Before St. Stanislaus parish and the Newman Center united to form Holy Spirit Parish in 2015, each of them had an endowment. An endowment is a pool of money that is invested and only the profits are used. The original pool of money is never spent. Churches and organizations establish endowments as a way for their members to give a gift that never stops giving. Their contribution is never spent. But when invested, it will continue to generate profits for as long as the organization exists.

Newman established their endowment in 2011 at the end of the "We Belong To Christ" Diocesan wide capital campaign. Every parish in the Diocese participated and gave twenty percent of the donations to the Diocese for its capital needs and put the other 80% to use in the parish. Some parishes had building projects or debts to pay. Newman was able to put \$400,000 in its Endowment and designated the income to be used for enriching the Campus Ministry Program. The Newman Center Endowment generates about \$14,000 a year and is restricted for Campus Ministry use.

St. Stan's started their endowment in 1998 and designated the income to go to supporting the general operations of the parish. Its current market value is \$656,000. St. Stan's Endowment has been generating about \$17,000 a year.

St. Stan's invested its funds as part of a pool of other parish endowments in the Diocese managed by BMO Harris. The Newman Center invested its funds through the Community Foundation of Central Wisconsin. Two years ago, the two Endowment Boards met together for a first time and discovered that they were not receiving similar returns nor being charged similar fees. Fees and rates of return were significantly better through the Diocesan pool.

The decision to move the Newman fund to the Diocesan pool was made over a year ago. When COVID struck and the markets became unpredictable, it was agreed to wait to move the funds until things settled down. The transfer is in process and will be made yet this summer. At the same time the Endowment Funds were renamed to be "The Holy Spirit Parish Endowment" and "The Holy Spirit Parish Campus Ministry Endowment". Their purposes remain the same.

Anyone may make a contribution of any size to either of these endowments and their gift will continue to support parish operations or Campus Ministry for as long as Holy Spirit Parish exists. To learn more please contact Becky Jirous, our parish Financial Director.

Everyday Stewardship: Recognize God in Ordinary Moments

WWMD?

WWJD bracelets were all the rage about 25 years ago in Christian circles. I've always wondered if a WWMD bracelet might not make just as much sense, and maybe more. What Would Mary Do?

I would argue that Mary was the most exemplary steward who ever lived. Her answer was always "Yes." Yes, Lord, I am Your handmaiden. Yes, I will visit Elizabeth, and help her in the last difficult months of pregnancy. Yes, I will bring my son up in the Mosaic law and present him at the Temple of Jerusalem. Yes, I will give him to the crowds and to public ministry. Yes, I will offer him on this Cross, if it is Your will.

Well, I can't be like Mary, we think to ourselves. There's an intimidation factor with the Blessed Mother and Catholics sometimes — one that almost exceeds that of Christ. An Easier Way to Give

Each month, Holy Spirit Parish initiates over 350 giving transactions via ACH (Automated Clearing House). ACH is a secure transaction between your bank and HSP's bank. Your bank data is safely housed on HSP's bank's server. HSP's bank requires multiple layer authentication in order for us to enter or access your data. Your bank records ACH transactions just as it would a check you write and it appears on your bank statement as such.



ACH transactions are automated and happen largely behind the scenes. They save HSP time in updating your annual giving statement and with less chance for error. As an extra benefit our bank does not charge us service charges (generally 3%) for ACH transactions. Nor do they charge you for the transaction. And, because they happen electronically, there are no material resources used. No checks, no envelopes, stamps, or gasoline involved!

It's easy to set-up ACH giving transactions for your Offertory or Building Fund giving. Once you authorize an ACH, you're done! Interested in learning more or want to sign up for ACH giving, please contact Becky Jirous at 344-9117.

*“Open your mouth in behalf of the mute, and for the rights of the destitute;
Open your mouth, judge justly, defend the needy and the poor!”* *Proverbs 31: 8-9*

Poverty, hunger, homelessness. Did you know that 44% of Stevens Point households, families and individuals, are living in poverty? Most are working but unable to meet the needs of basic household essentials—childcare, food, healthcare, housing, or a basic phone plan (most recent data available, published from 2010-2018, the Alice report).

Since childhood, we have heard Catholic social teaching challenging and instructing us to reach out to the vulnerable, the poor and the hurting. The Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of our moral vision. Our lives will be judged by our response to the “least of these”; our parish will be measured by our sacrifice for those alienated in our own community and the world beyond.

At Holy Spirit parish there are many opportunities each month for you to serve “the least of these” with charity. The Salvation Army Tuesday evening meal project needs help with the August 31st and Sept 7th meals. More dates to fill will be coming in November, December and January during the University breaks. Please contact Patty Noel at peggynoel3209@aol.com if you can help.

Matthew 25 collections “For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat....” are published every month in the bulletin. They are important and help sustain charitable groups that provide for the basic needs of our neighbors. Your donations, delivered to the parish center the first week of each month are greatly appreciated.

School starts soon and Feeding Hungry Kids will again be providing cheese, fruit and cereal bars to SPASH students. About 30% of the high school students’ families meet federal poverty guidelines. Special collections are held at Thanksgiving but donations are accepted at any time, earmarked for Hungry Kids.
