

Dear Holy Spirit Parish:

"Your faith has saved you." (Luke 17:19)

All ten of the lepers cried out to Jesus for help. All of them were physically healed. But only one of them was also spiritually healed. Only one underwent the realignment of will that brings right relationship. Only one was saved. It was the one who lifted his heart from his own good fortune to fathom the heart of the one from whom his

good fortune came. It was the one who was filled with gratitude. Evidently a grateful heart is the sure way that one has been saved.

I don't know if Bishop Callahan planned it this way, but you couldn't pick better Gospels for the weekends you wanted to launch a Capital Campaign than last week's "faith like a mustard seed" and this week's "your faith has saved you."

Even though Sandy and I went quite long last week (and I certainly do not intend for Mass to go that long routinely), there was so much more that could be said about the importance of our Child Care Center. There are two things that stand out to me. First, our Child Care Center serves the whole community and not just families with children in K-12 Catholic Schools. If you are in the majority of families in our parish who send your children to public schools, you may be asking why you should support the upgrading of our school building. The answer is, Stevens Point has a severe shortage of childcare. It is true that there is an over 100 child waiting list to get into our program, but there are similar waiting lists for many of the other childcare programs in town.

Secondly, during the height of Covid when schools, churches and many businesses were closed, our Child Care Center remained open to make it possible for parents to continue to go to work. It is no exaggeration to say that our teachers put their lives on the line to help families make it through the pandemic. We have been and are providing a critical service to our community.


Everyone should have received a brochure in the mail this past week explaining in detail the purpose of the campaign and how it is structured. Hopefully by now you are convinced of the importance of the projects we address through the campaign and are wondering how to get your hands on a pledge card!

Because we all get so many requests for help in the mail, we are trying to make as many personal visits as possible in this campaign. I can say that some of the people I have visited started out quite disinterested in another capital campaign but once they learned of the needs this campaign is addressing, they become quite supportive. Again, we have raised \$575,000 from just 42 parish members. They became convinced of the importance of keeping the school in good running order as well as being energy efficient and handicapped accessible throughout all our buildings. Thus we hope to have the chance to change many other people's assumptions through personal visits.

When a person receives a visit from a campaign volunteer, they have the opportunity to make a pledge. Please call the office to let us know if you would like a volunteer to visit with you. We will make as many visits as we can during October. The last weekend of October we will make pledge cards available in church for those who have not been visited.

If you are wondering how much to pledge, consider a pledge of \$45 a month for this five-year campaign. Some can do much more, some much less. But if we all do what we can, we will be able to add to our reasons to return to the Lord in gratitude, a Child Care Center that is providing excellent service to our community.
