He now needs area citizens to volunteer 3 to 4 hours per week, sometime between 10:30 am and 5 pm, to "waste time with people" who need to have someone listen to them. Time can be flexible from week to week, although it does help the staff if there are some folks who come at the same time each week.

The volunteers should have the ability and interest in listening non-judgmentally, converse with compassion and become (at least for the time together) a companion with a person on a journey in life. There is no TV in the building, most have cellphones and the library is across the street for time and place for reading.
