MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.



FROM THE PASTOR

Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple, (Luke 14:25-33).

There's a story about a father who loss his daughter in a car accident. For a while he was struggling to understand why this happened to him and his family. He talked to family therapy and his family were supporting and were there for him. One day, he decided to go for a hiking on the mountain. He left on one early morning, dumbfounded with nature as well as the breeze of the morning dew, he continued on for hours until he came to find a small old cabin in the woods.

Exhausted and dehydrated from his long walk, he decided to rest and curious to stop by to rest in front of the cabin. When he arrived, he put his little backpack down, pull out his bottle of water and sipped a little. Then, he stood up and opened the front door of the cabin, went in, and stroll around. It looks like no one lived there for months or years. Then, he got sight at an open book on the floor, he bent down to pick it up, and it was a bible. It had a bookmark set on the Gospel of Matthew with highlight marks on it. It says, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; and you shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and burden light, (Mt. 11:28-29). He pondered and reflected on these words of Jesus for sometimes, and found himself sleeping on the floor.

Today, we heard from our Lord an invitation and one of His hard sayings, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Jesus alludes to guide the children of God to the foundation and the purpose of life. The call to discipleship and what entails to be one. Each and every one of us like the father in the story goes through some hardship in life. Our faith strengthen us to trust, rely, and depend on God for His guidance and His help. A constructor or a king needs preparation and plan of action to build and seek wisdom and counsel before going for war, so as we in our faith. We need to prepare, polish our relationship with one another by sharing and giving our talents, gifts, and treasures to bless others; our families, to our faith community and the holy Church. We need to help, support, unleash the Gospel of Jesus, and do temporal and spiritual works to share the mission of the Lord in works and words.

As Jesus said in the holy Gospel of Luke, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Each and every one of us has challenges and hardships in life, by fixing our eyes on Jesus, we cannot do anything by following his passion and His example of love, and His purpose for us: Do the will of God. As we journey through our life, and our life of faith, let's pause and reflect on the meaning of our life, our blessings, our challenges, our hopes, our loved ones, how we treat others: We must reveal the exuberant joy and love of God in our works of faith, love and care in our families and be active in practicing our faith sharing in the mission of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
