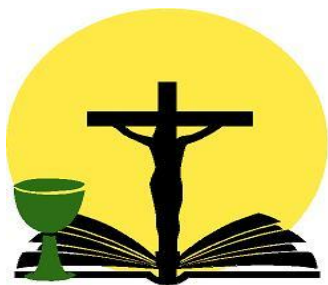

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Stewardship Bulletin Reflection Last Weeked April 24, 2022 — Second Sunday of Easter/Sunday of Divine Mercy
ACTS 5:12-16; PS 118: 2-4,13-15, 22; REV 1:9-11A, 12-13, 17-19; JN 20: 19-31

Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, is Divine Mercy Sunday. Our Gospel reading from St. John is often called the story of “Doubting Thomas” but the passage involves so much more than the encounter with the skeptical apostle. It is rich with lessons of Christ’s mercy to all, including an encouraging word from our Lord especially for us, His modern-day disciples. Let us remember that none of the Apostles were at their best when Christ first appeared to them after His resurrection. They were actually in hiding, cowering behind a locked door, paralyzed by fear and doubt. But Jesus appeared right in their midst in spite of the lock on the door. Was it to rebuke them for their lack of faith? Quite the contrary. He comes on a mission of mercy. He comes to offer them peace and the restoration of their relationship with Him. And even more, He commissions them to become ministers of His mercy, by giving them authority to forgive sins. At that moment Christ gives to all of us the supreme gift of mercy — the sacrament of Reconciliation. What a precious and powerful gift! This Sunday is a perfect time to reflect on how well we make use of this gift. Do we really appreciate its healing power? Could we become better stewards of this gift by going to Confession more often? We must also reflect on how well we extend mercy to others as Jesus did to Thomas that day.

All too often, the fog and despair of mental illness can leave someone feeling alone and misunderstood. - 1. Loud Talking** is not appropriate. **Please**, greet your neighbor, say hello to a friend, welcome a newcomer, but always with respect for where you are.
- 2. We turn off cell phones and pagers** so that the sacred nature of the liturgy is not disturbed.
- 3. Dress well in modestly** as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, our secret meal a sacrifice. We are gathered to meet the Lord in the liturgy and each other, and dress shows respect for that truth.
- 4. Chewing gum or eating** is inappropriate in the church. Children's snacks should be a simple as possible, and parents need to clean up any spills.
- 5. We are consciously reverted** toward the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. We genuflect to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament when we enter and exit the church. We bow to the altar as a sign of Christ when we pass in front of it.
- 6. Listen respectfully** to the word of God as it is proclaimed. Christ is truly present in the word. **Crying children** can be taken to the community room or outside until they are Calm call me enough to return.
- 7. Participate consciously in actively** with your brothers and sisters gathered for the Eucharistic Liturgy. Christ is truly present in the community gathered. Sing, pray, meditate in silence, give yourself fully.
- 8. Pray and respond** during the Eucharistic prayer. The real presence of Christ is in the bread and wine that become His Body and Blood on the altar by the power of the Holy Spirit, the action of the priest and the prayer of the people.
- 9. Sing with the full hearts and minds and voices** during the entire liturgy. Each hymn, refrain and response is a prayer of the community.
- 10. Respect the space around you.** Put the missalette and hymnal back in the rack, take your bulletin with you, check for any papers or trash. Make your place clean and welcoming for those who will come to the next liturgy.
- 11. Out of respect** for the sacred liturgy, we come early enough to be comfortably seated and in a prayerful disposition before the Mass begins. We do not leave before the priest, deacon, and servers have processed out.
